Title	Name of Presentation
Description of the presentation	Content shall be in 400 words or less. Emphasize the educational elements of the presentation. <i>(Sales-oriented presentations will not be considered.)</i> Presentations must provide unbiased, valuable information about a technology, technique, case study, etc. Co-presentations and case studies with a municipal representative are encouraged. Most sessions are 30 minutes, which includes time for audience Q&A. Due to the session length, we request that proposals/presentations include no more than two speakers.
Learning Outcomes	List at least three goals or outcomes of the presentation. What will participants have learned by the time they leave your session?
Short Biography	2-3 sentences (about 100 words)
Previous Presentations	List the conference/seminar, date and topic of other speaking engagements.
